#### Agenda

#### 1. Call to Order

• Chuck Braxton called the meeting to order at 10:05 AM.

#### 2. Minutes of previous meetings

• Donna Van Ness moved to accept the minutes of the 7/14/2012 annual meeting. Frank Van Ness seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

#### 3. Treasurer's report and budget for coming year

• Ray Moritz presented the Treasurer's Report and budget for the remainder of 2013 and for calendar year 2014, which are attached.

#### 4. President's report

- Chuck Braxton introduced Elizabeth Baird, who recently sold the portion of her property between the railroad tracks and the river, and thanked her for her generous support of the efforts to conserve and protect the land along the shores of Snake River.
- Braxton then described efforts of the last year and ongoing projects.

#### 5. Member Recognition

- Chuck Braxton recognized members for their significant contributions to the WWC: **Duncan McNeish** for his efforts to stop the Meredith Zoning Board of Adjustment's variance for drains on Foundry Ave; **Biron Bedard** for legal services, most recently in support of the purchase of the Baird property on Snake River; **Stan Wallerstein** for legal services in support of the purchase of the Spear property along Snake River; **Boo Gershun** for her efforts in taking the water samples for the Volunteer Lake Assessment Program (VLAP); **John Wright** and **George Nassor**, who are taking over the VLAP effort on Lake Waukewan; and **Tim Whiting** for his efforts managing the Meredith Lake Host program.
- Braxton also thanked members who have opted for higher level membership, in particular Valerie and Laurie Castleman, who became Conservators.

#### 6. Election of Directors

• Boo Gershun moved to nominate Chuck Braxton for a 3-year term as Director. Donna Van Ness seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

#### 7. Questions and Remarks from the floor

- In response to a question by Boo Gershun about the status of Monkey Pond, Chuck Braxton described the WWC's commitment of \$5K in support of a 1-year study leading to a remediation plan for the pond.
- Tim Whiting asked about WWC's thoughts about publishing a newsletter. Chuck Braxton mentioned that the WWC is adding news to the dues solicitation letters. Whiting stated a preference for an actual newsletter, a thought supported by other members.
- In response to a question by George Earl, Braxton described WWC's thinking about efforts to get back former members.
- In response to a question by Boo Gershun, Braxton described the chain of events leading to the decision to adopt the d/b/a name of Windy Waters Conservancy, recognized that there is still confusion among the public about the name, and agreed that more needs to be done to communicate with the public. Don Thompson stated a hope that the WWC can mend fences and get back to using a more unified name.

#### 6. Adjourn

• At 10:52 AM, Donna Van Ness moved that the business meeting be adjourned. The motion was seconded by Leslie Steele and passed unanimously.

### **Technical Presentations**

#### Snake River Stewardship Plan

Ralph Kirshner, Chairman, New Hampton Conservation Commission, described the Snake River Stewardship Plan, which covers the recently purchased Elizabeth Baird and Spear properties. He described the Snake River Stewardship Committee as a special commission. The Stewardship Plan, he noted, has many constraints such as a one-year period in which to use the approved funding including the creation of a trail on the property. Due to the difficult wetlands on the Spear portion of the combined properties, the trail will be only on the Baird portion. He expects that the plan that will be implemented will be a good example of what can be done to educate people about the property and why it is important to conserve it. #### Economic and Cultural Impacts of Conservation in the Lakes Region

Mark Billings, Chairman of the Meredith Conservation Commission and Treasurer of the Town of Meredith, described his background as growing up in a small town much like Meredith and becoming an investment banker and economist for 40 years. His environmental focus started with his involvement with Meredith's Page Pond project as an abutter. He is now a member of the "Trust for Public Lands." He noted that interest in conserving the environment is personal; different people have very different reasons for that interest, such as preserving beauty, maintaining water quality, avoiding overdevelopment, and maintaining property values, to name a few. He noted that a major metric investors use in deciding to make an investment is "Return on Investment" or ROI — after a period of time, how much more will the investment return than it cost. He noted that conserving something in perpetuity makes the issue of ROI moot. In 2010 an important change in New Hampshire law specified that only a Conservation Commission may hold property outside of the town's boundary. This allowed Meredith to contribute to the purchase and stewardship of the Spear and Baird properties and obtain an environmental easement on them. Billings sees the Spear and Baird properties as a tremendous educational effort.
